Total Federal R and D for infrastructure was 103 million in FY85, or roughly 0.3 percent of total new infrastructure construction (see table 1-1). Of this amount, OTA estimates that Federal agencies spent around 36 million on R and D for infrastructure materials; 14 million on incremental and advanced improvements in construction technologies and methods; and the remainder to improve design, evaluations, needs analyses, management systems, feasibility studies, information dissemination, etc. The types of, and levels of funding for, Federally-sponsored R and D programs related to public works vary widely (see tables 1-2 and 1-3). Domestic public works projects tend to borrow technologies and materials developed for other applications (e. g. , fiber-reinforced concrete). Federal research agendas reflect this in their emphases on adapting available products for specific public works applications, on analyses of public works capacity, and on management support. OTA found no significant Federal R and D expenditures for advanced construction technologies, or to support the design or development of alternative infrastructure systems, such as a totally new way of delivering water.
